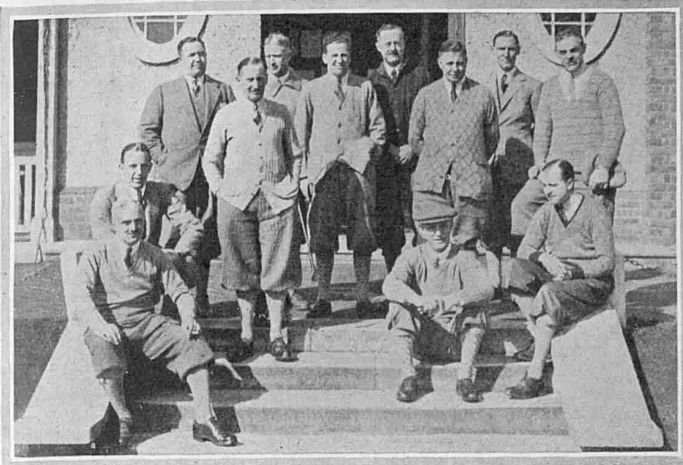
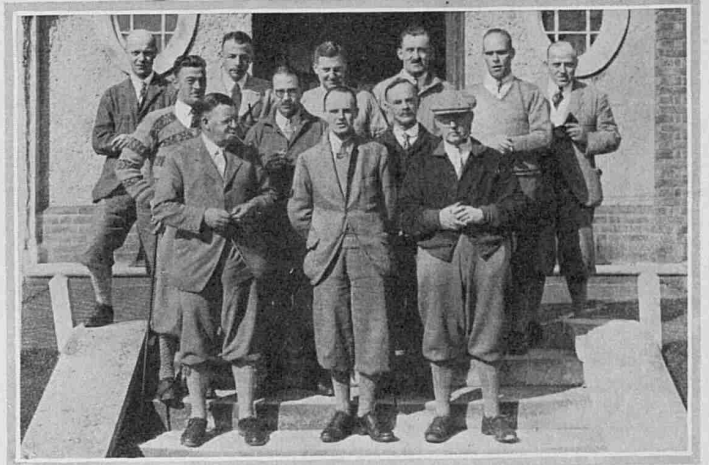


A THRILLING FINISH TO THE 'VARSITY MATCH: GOLF ITEMS.



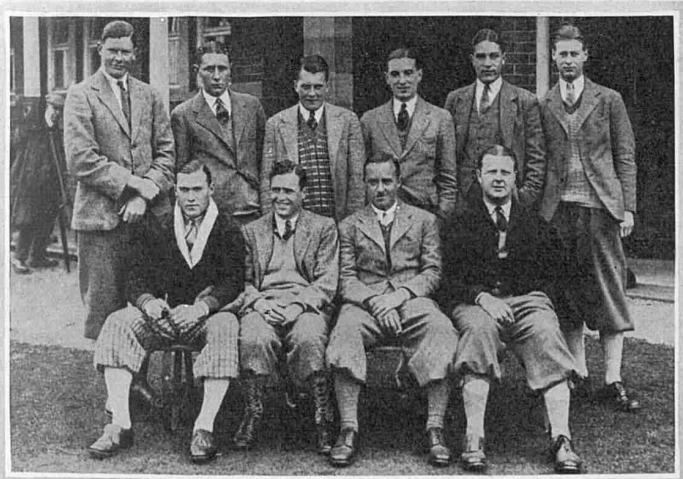

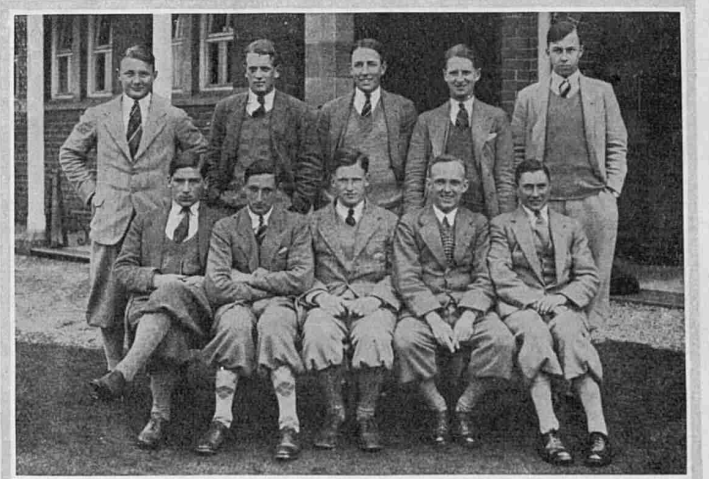

There could scarcely have been a more exciting finish to the University golf match than that last week, when Cambridge defeated Oxford by 9 matches to 6 at Hoylake. The foursomes, played first, resulted in the Dark Blues gaining a lead by one match, but in the singles, after a ding-dong struggle, including some terrific individual tussles, Cambridge recovered the lost ground and a little more also. R. H. Oppenheimer took his Light Blue opponent, G. H. Grimwade, to the 41st hole before being beaten, a feat that is not on record as having happened before in a first-class match between men. A few days earlier a fixture at Sunningdale, decided by four-balls and singles, took place between the Baltic and Cardiff Exchanges, the former winning by 11 matches to 6.
