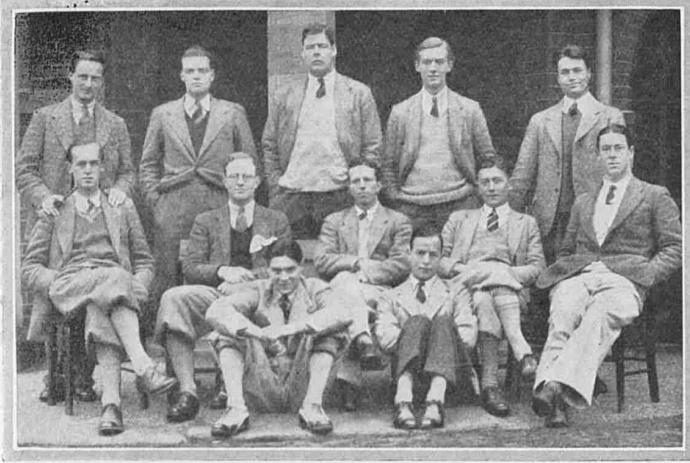

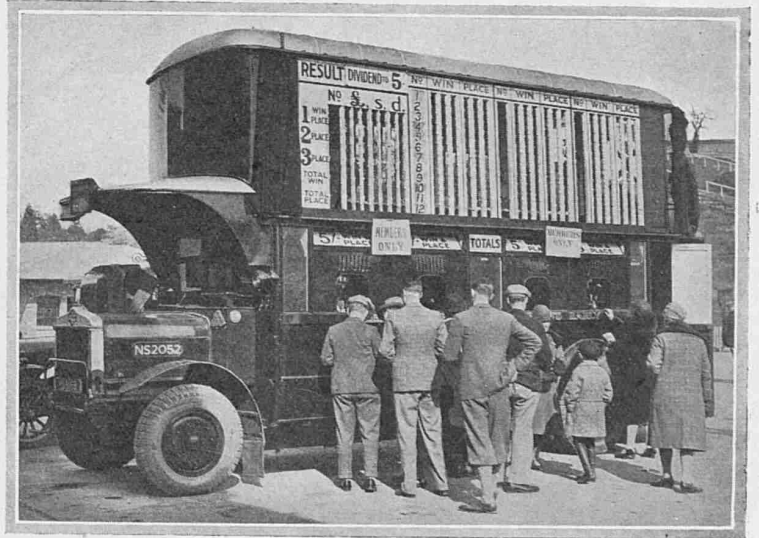

The 47th University golf match between Oxford and Cambridge was played last Tuesday and Wednesday at Hoylake, the foursomes on the first and the singles on the second day. The Oxford team included three Americans, the captain, R. H. Baugh, C. Sweeny and H. Scheffel. The brother of the last named, S. Scheffel, was one of the Dark Blue reserves, making a total of four players in all from the States.—The first race of the flat racing season on the opening day of the Lincoln meeting was won by the favourite, Mr. E. Robson's Claudine (F. Lane up) by a short head from Mr. Walter Grigg's Storm Cycle. The winner's number was 13.—The Brooklands Automobile Racing Club held their first meeting last Saturday, when the Southport Motor Club also held races on Ainsdale Sands. At the former meeting a tote, mounted on a lorry, was in use. At Southport the sons of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle appeared as competitors.
